2020 NWKGC Online Koi Show

With the postponement of the 40th Annual ZNA NW Koi Show until 2021, the NWKGC Board has decided to host a Online unsanctioned koi show to encourage participation of our club members in the virtual world. Entry is free with our main goal being to provide a stress-free and fun event for club members.

Rules and Entry Procedures

Entry Rules:

- 1) Entrant must be a member in good standing of the NWKGC on or before July 1, 2020
- 2) Must be a hobbyist to enter the show- no koi professionals (dealers, brokers, handlers etc.).
- 3) Koi must be alive and healthy at time of photograph.
- 4) Member must own the koi entered and it must reside in their personal pond.
- 5) Photos must have been taken after January 1st, 2020.
- 6) Entry opens on July 1st, 2020.
- 7) Entry of koi must be submitted by the July 31st, 2020 at 11:59 pm PST.
- 8) No photo alterations are allowed. Cropping and rotating photographs are allowed.
- 9) Photos must be of individual koi No group photos. Photo of entered koi should have a blue background at 6'oclock position.
- 10) Allow NWKGC to announce the winning koi, with the owner's name, on all social media platforms and club publications.
- 11) Participants may enter as many koi, or as few koi, as they desire.
- 12) Past NWKGC Grand Champions will be allowed to enter.
- 13) Entry is free to all members in good standing.
- 14) Awards, if not to be picked up at a future in-person club meeting, shipping cost falls on the member who won the award.

By entering into the Online Koi Show, the owner agrees to the aforementioned rules.

Entry Procedure

- 1) Take a picture of your koi. Blue background containers are best to show the koi to its full potential and contrast. Videos will not be accepted for entries but taking video of each koi is encouraged for future promotional activity.
- 2) Send one picture per koi via email. Specify the size of the koi in inches as well as the variety class in the description of the koi. If you need help determining the variety, the Bencher (Brady Layman at show@nwkg.org) can be of assistance or you can check the Koi Classification page on the club website at www.nwkg.org Note; A 12" koi will be classified as a Size 2. All larger koi will be classified to the next higher size class. Example would be a 24" koi will be classified as a Size 5 Koi. If you koi falls on the edge of size class, i.e. 8",12",16",20",24", or 28" please verify your measurements so the koi can be placed in the correct size.
- 3) Wait for confirmation that the koi have been entered. If confirmation is not sent, please check in with us at show@nwkg.org

Judging

Judging will be commencing no later than the 3rd of August 2020. Entrants should not communicate with the judges about the judging during the show.

Koi Arena

The Koi Arena will be in the NWKGC 2020 Online Show Facebook group. Each entrant will be assigned a virtual tank number upon entry. Koi will be grouped by size/variety classes, with descriptions containing tank numbers, koi individual entry numbers, and size in photograph descriptions. Once all entries are received and entered, all posts will be locked, and the group will be opened for members to join and view.

Awards Ceremony

A free virtual Awards Ceremony for all club members will be held on the 23rd of August, 2020 at 5 pm PST via Zoom. An email to all club members, judges, and other invited guests, will be sent out prior to when it occurs.
